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Learn How to Become a Respite Provider at September Training in McCook

The Nebraska Lifespan Respite program is providing training for individuals interested in becoming Respite Providers on Saturday, September 12th in McCook. “The training will be held at 404 West 10th Street in McCook,” explains Helena Janousek, Respite Network Southwest Area Coordinator. “We will start the training at 9:00 a.m. and finish by 5:00 p.m. with lunch provided. Space is limited for the training.” September 1st is the registration deadline.

This eight hour training covers a wide variety of topics including:

- handling emergency situations
- disability awareness
- dealing with behaviors
- feeding
- transferring
- hygiene
- confidentiality
- building your relationship with the family and the care recipient
- fun activities to do during respite time

During this unique, interactive and fun training program, you will receive the education and tools needed to be confident and successful in providing respite care to adults and children.

“Those attending will have the opportunity to apply to become a part of the Nebraska Respite Network database of respite providers,” states Janousek. “Providers with the Network are self-employed and negotiate duties, schedules, and wages directly with the families who contact them.”

Family caregivers are also invited to attend. If you are caring for a family member with a disability or special health condition and would like to feel more relaxed and sure of yourself, this training is also for you. The ultimate goal of this course is for participants to learn the three key steps of support: prepare, care & connect.

According to the National Family Caregivers Association, in any given year, over 65 million people provide some level of caregiving services. Of today's family caregivers, 40% provide some level of nursing support.
