January is Radon Action Month

McCook – Southwest Nebraska Public Health Department is working with the U.S. Environmental Agency (EPA) on a nationwide campaign to educate Americans about the dangers of radon exposure. SWNPHD urges area residents to take action by testing their homes for radon during January.

“Radon was not in my vocabulary before I started working at Southwest Nebraska Public Health Department,” explains Denise Garey, Certified Radon Measurement Specialist. “Through radon education, hands-on testing, and the support of local and state radon experts, I am determined to increase radon testing in southwest Nebraska,” states Garey.

Educating the public has been a focus of SWNPHD through the radon poster contest, which is open to youth ages 9-14. The top 30 posters from our nine-county district are currently on display at McCook Abstract & Title Company located at 318 Norris Avenue. “We encourage residents to view these creative posters that share information about radon, radon testing and radon mitigation”, explains Garey.

Radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer in the United States and the leading cause of lung cancer in nonsmokers. It is a colorless, odorless and tasteless gas that enters homes and buildings through the breakdown of uranium in the soil and cannot be detected unless it is tested. In Nebraska, one out of every two homes tested has a high radon level (above 4.0 pCi/L).
