
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
I. Demographics


Graph below depicts the **age range** of respondents, further categorized by **gender**.

Although a **total of 577 responses** were recorded (see table of race/ ethnicity on page 4) alone, when considering the total persons who had answered all demographic background questions completely (age AND gender AND county AND race/ethnicity), the **total was only 558**. Graph below depicts the **<u>race and ethnicity</u>** of respondents.



Graph below describes the responses to the questions:


- Do you, or anyone in your family have a disability?

Responses are yes/ no, and they have been further disaggregated as male/ female.




If you have health insurance, does it meet the following standards?

- Other



III. Health Concerns and Barriers




Graph describes the cumulative percentages of all mentions of a health problem among the respondents' list of top 3 health problems facing people in the district. So, if alcohol was number 1 for one person and third for another, they are both given the same weight.

- NOT BEING KNOWN OF PATIENTS RIGHTS AND THE PROPER INFORMATION TO CARE.




Graph describes the cumulative percentages of all mentions of access issues by respondents. Similarly, the cumulative number of mentions of healthy habits by all respondents is represented.

Data is presented as proportions, further disaggregated by gender. Each of the options is noted instead of a legend.


What would make your neighborhood a healthier place for you or your family?

- BEING INFORMED ABOUT THE PROPER RULES AND LAWS






IV. COVID Response



Graph describes the cumulative percentages of all mentions of a COVID related issue by respondents. Multiple responses were recorded. Total is noted separately. 'Other' included "none", "stress", "masking", "volunteering", and one respondent who complained of "discrimination" because he "refused to take the vaccine".

Data is presented as proportions, further disaggregated by age (20-year categories). Each of the impacts is noted in the legend.



Graph describes the cumulative percentages of all pandemic related information sources mentioned by respondents. Multiple responses were recorded. 'Other' numbered only 13 responses, and included "sick of the propaganda", "booster sites", "how about the truth", "election infection is a hoax", and "no problems"
